Following Bills in the NH Legislature

Although **HB 544** was tabled in the House, it was later attached to the 2022-2023 biennial budget, before the Senate this week. Some senators including our **Sen. Becky Whitley** explained the bill and their opposition in the <u>Sunday Concord Monitor April 25</u>.

5/5/21 Hearing in Senate Executive Departments and Administration Committee HB 417 terminates a state of emergency called by the governor after 30 days and modifies the procedure for renewal. Any orders issued during the period of a renewal of the state of emergency shall be subject to prior approval by the House of Representatives.

5/5/21 Hearing in House Labor Committee

SB 123 This bill waives cost-sharing for COVID-19 testing under accident and health insurance policies. To express your opinion online:


