Warner Area Food Pantry needs small clean boxes for distribution of Food Pantry items. Please, size should be no bigger than 18" because the goods are HEAVY and recipients are often frail! Boxes and donations of food or toiletry items may be left on the LEFT side of the front steps at the Old Graded School building at 49 West Main St. (CAP building).

Preparing for Library lending: Paper bags and **small** boxes are also needed by the Library for distributing books and movies for curbside pickup, which we hope to start by May 18. Paper and cardboard are safer than plastic because the COVID virus does not survive as long on paper. Contact us to arrange a drop-off time, or place them under cover by the Main Street side entry .
