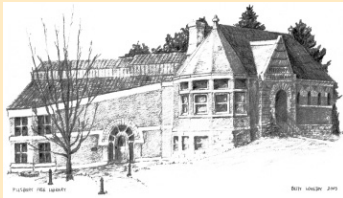

### Fourteen N.H. State Parks Now Open for Visitors



#### Ask for our N.H. State Parks Library Pass

As of June 12, 2020, nine more N.H. Parks are open (a total of 14). Our library pass saves you money! However, the library pass does not guarantee entrance into any park. You also need to [reserve a parking space at the park](#), ahead of your arrival.

**The FootHills** of Warner: 7 am - 1 pm takeout, indoor dining by reservation.

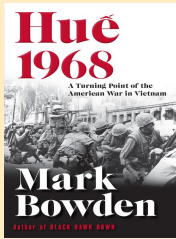
**Schoolhouse Cafe:** takeout, limited indoor (call ahead) Tues-Sun 6 am - 2 pm

A great way to let staff know what you want to borrow (and to get your name in line first!) is to place a hold via our catalog.

**Step 1:** Find your library card and password. [Contact us](#) if you forgot, or need to get a card.

**Step 2:** Go to the catalog at [warner.lib.nh.us](http://warner.lib.nh.us)

**Step 3:** Type in your 14 digit card # (no spaces) and your password.

**Step 4:** Search for an item by author, title, genre, subject or key word.

**Step 5:** When you find the item you want, place a hold by clicking "Place Hold" and confirming.
