Warner Re-Openings

Warner Pharmacy is moving into allowing customers inside on request. Outside service will continue and is encouraged.

The Kearsarge Regional School District administration is aiming for a JUNE 29 reopening of school playgrounds and athletic fields. Guidelines are being reviewed and signage created to minimize risks.

Warner Board of Selectmen has NOT yet started meeting in person at Warner Town Hall. We spoke too soon last week.

Independence Day Holiday 2020:

There will **NOT** be a public pancake breakfast on Sat., July 4.

Warner Transfer Station will be closed Sat. July 4 but open on Sun. July 5. The Library will be closed July 4 (& 5)

Crime watch: items are being stolen from cars in driveways. Lock your car at night!

Dog Ordinance in Town Parks: Dog Leash/Clean Up Requirements - A friendly reminder to all dog owners. The Town has an ordinance that has established that all dogs be leashed while inside Town recreation areas, and leashed or under voice command in Town common areas, and that the handler remove defecation as it occurs, in all areas.

School meals: The Kearsarge School District will be extending the current pandemic-related free school breakfast and lunch deliveries through the end of the summer break. Starting July 1, 2020, delivery schedules will change, but they will continue to provide meals for seven days per week. Conserve Water: The Warner Village Water District Commissioners have instituted a ban until further notice on outside water usage except for use on vegetable and flower gardens.


