- Borrow from our small but varied <u>Large</u>
 Print collection
- 2. Use a tablet, or computer, to borrow an ebook from nh.overdrive.com and enlarge the font [print] size. Access is free with a library card.
- 3. On a computer screen, you can often enlarge everything by holding down the "CTRL" key and tapping the + [plus] key repeatedly. Use the minus sign key to shrink it.
- 4. Contact <u>Future in Sight</u> to have them assess your personal needs and habits to provide FREE assistive visual devices and advice to help you cope with low vision.


