
## Tech Tips

If the title you want is not listed in the library Catalog, or the library copy is checked out... **Option 1**. Look at the top of the catalog screen to see if it is available as an ebook or audiobook from nh.overdrive.com (image below) and click on the results to see the status and borrow or hold.

Your search returned 4 results.



Option 2. To find a "you may also like" suggestion, click on EBSCO resources (either on the library home page or on the left side of the catalog page). YOu will need to tyoe in your library card #. Select "Novelist" (or Novelist Plus to include nonfiction).

Type in the title you originally wanted, and there will be Read-alikes" listed on the left side.

**Option 3**. Place a hold on the title and wait for it to be available




