Warning! Carts empty themselves after a while.

Suspending holds

For titles you want to defer to a later date, you can place a hold and then "suspend" it until a set date of your choice. When the set date arrives, you will be notified as soon as it is available.

Unsure when you will be ready? Suspend the hold with no set date and return to edit it later.

Suspend all holds until 07/31/2020 Clear date to suspend indefinitely


