Anyone who is **resurfacing their driveway** needs to fill out a driveway permit form prior to having work done. Patching or resealing does not require a permit. <u>Driveway Regulations</u> <u>Driveway application</u>

Census 2020

If you own a building that is not a full time residence, you still need to file a census report on it and tell them there are Zero residents. That will save workers time calling or visiting to get the information. Seasonal homeowners can call in their information <u>844-330-2020</u>. If you received the paper questionnaire at your seasonal home, you only need to answer the questions on the first page, and send it in.

You can also file online at <u>census.gov.</u>


