Indian Museum Receives Bird Houses



Mt .**Kearsarge Indian Museum** in Warner has received a special gift from Eagle Scout Harry Bullock of Troop 23 in North Attleboro, Mass. He and 5 other Scouts built and installed 20 houses for five different bird species: the white breasted nuthatch, tree swallow, screech owl, barred owl and great crested fly catcher. Different sized houses with various-sized entry holes were necessary for these birds. To help prevent diseases from spreading, the houses should be cleaned out annually, so each needed an access panel.

The updated absentee voting ballot

request form now has a checkbox for concern for COVID-19. On the Ballot Return envelope, you may check off the "disability" box if you are concerned about covid-19 at in-person voting. Remember to put your name on the outside of the ENVELOPE or your ballot cannot be counted. Once checked off on the voter list by the moderator, he removes the envelope before passing your ballot to the counters, to maintain confidentiality .

Sample Ballots for the State Primary Election on Sept. 8 can be downloaded from the Town of Warner website: <u>Democratic, Republican.</u> The form to request a mail-in ballot is <u>found here</u>. Polling hours are 7 AM to 7 PM at the Warner Town Hall. Information about voting, including absentee ballots, is on the <u>Town Clerk's page</u>. **100th Anniversary!** You may notice colored banners at the Library and Town Hall from Aug. 17 to 27, commemorating when Tennessee ratified the **19th amendment to the Constitution** in 1920, giving Women the right to vote.




Local Heroes in the Spotlight
