The Warner Fire Department recently received a new Engine 1, replacing the previous 25 year old engine. Thanks to having a new Fire Station building, it did not need to be custom-height to fit the ceiling limitations of the old station!

Installation of the fire danger sign, with its accompanying roof and Smokey the Bear sculpture, was completed this summer thanks to **Ben Blakeslee** of Warner. Ben took on the fundraising, design and coordination as his Eagle Scout project. He was assisted by fellow scouts of Troop #77 of Hopkinton. The IRS wants you to know that unemployment income is taxable income, when it is time to pay federal taxes. "The State will provide taxpayers with a paper Form 1099-G or make it available electronically by January 31St showing the amount of taxable benefits paid".




Teen Talk by Linda Lacasse
