CONTACT US for the special promo code to be used instead of our paper coupons, to get our library pass discounted entry fee of \$10 per adult (instead of the regular cost of \$25, or \$30 with special exhibit access). The Museum will be open five days a week: Wednesday–Sunday, 10 am–5 pm

Users can now share titles on social media or directly with friends, using the Share button found on a title's Reading Journey and details screen. A shared title page shows the book's summary, basic details, and nearby libraries that offer the title through Libby.

Library TECH TIPS: Using "Advanced search" in catalog

Looking for seasonal children's books in our catalog? Try using the "advanced search" or simply change the type of search, to use call numbers to browse the list of titles we would usually have on display for you. Use "HALLOW" for Halloween, "THANKS" for Thanksgiving, XMAS for Christmas books, etc.

When you have decided what to request, Place a hold on the item(s) line to request them.

You will need to log in using your library card number as Username, and your password to see the "Place Hold" option. contact us for help.

HINT: if there are too many pages of results, you can also filter it using "limit to currently available items".




