

Keeping Library Air Healthy!





The Library Trustees voted Sept. 8 to install iWave bipolar ionization units in the library air handlers, to help combat infectious agents that might come into the library. Although this is a sizable unexpected expense, it was deemed a worthwhile investment to protect the health and safety of the staff and anyone borrowing items from the library, as we go into the season when outside air ventilation is less practical.

How it works: positive and negative ions sent into the air in each room can attach to particles of virus, bacteria, molds, and other allergens. The virus or bacteria then break down much faster than normal, so the total number of infectious particles is reduced. The ions also can attach to other small particles like pollens, causing them to clump together and settle out faster or get caught in filters more easily.

The units have now been installed, thanks to speedy scheduling by Precision Temperature Control in Bedford, and next we will be purchasing an ion detection device to help us select the best air flow settings for distribution.




