



Teen Talk by Linda Lacasse

Rick Riordan has created several successful book series for teens. He is the most requested teen author in our library!



He conceived the idea for the Percy Jackson series as bedtime stories about ancient Greek heroes for his son Haley. Haley had been diagnosed with ADHD and dyslexia, inspiring Riordan to make the titular protagonist ADHD and dyslexic.

Percy Jackson and the Olympians series features the twelve-year-old who discovers he is the modern-day son of the ancient Greek god Poseidon. This five book series inspired a feature film.

Riordan also created a sequel series to Percy Jackson, <u>The Heroes of Olympus</u>. Five demigods have to put aside their grief and follow Percy's instructions to find the mortal side of the Doors of Death.

The Five book series about Camp Half-Blood, The Trials of Apollo, features Apollo who has been turned into a human and banished from Olympus. He is on his path to restoring five ancient Oracles and reclaiming his godly powers.
