# In and Around Warner

Clocks "Fall Back" one hour to Eastern Standard Time on Sunday, November 1.

REMINDER: Fire permits are required for all burning, unless there is snow covering the ground (for 100 feet around the fire).

Effective 10/21/2020 all NH open burning (Category 3 fires, brush pile fires) are permitted with **normal fire permit requirements**. The online fire permit system is at NHFirepermit.com.

VOTE! Tuesday, Nov. 3. Absentee ballots may be handed in until 5 pm. Please remember that clothing etc. mentioning political candidates is not allowed inside the polling space.

## **Library Tech Tip: TDS emails**

If you are using a tds.net email address, you may have received a notice that after Nov 18, you'll need to call a TDS Repair Advisor at 1-866-983-7249 to add new email addresses to your account. Confused? By signing in to your account at portal.tds.net it has been possible to create or delete extra email addresses hosted by your account, so that each member of your household might have their own address.

(Some of you may have noticed that the library has several tds.net emails). After November 18, changes can only be made by calling TDS support (Presumably to reduce hacking and fake accounts). Most people prefer email addresses from other providers like yahoo, gmail, or Outlook/Hotmail, but if you are happy with a tds.net email, you can take advantage of this ability to hold several email addresses on your account. You can also manage them to forward to one central account.






