Warner residents Natalie Wells and Faith

Minton were both candidates for the NH House in Merrimack <u>District 25</u>. Natalie won with 3247 votes to Faith's 2902. Warner's incumbent for <u>District 7</u>, **Clyde Carson**, was edged out in a close race with Margaret Kennedy, 1566 to 1479. Thank you, Clyde, for your 8 years of service!

The Merrimack County Sherriff's race between Warner's **Dennis Crawford** and David Croft was not fully tallied at the time this was published, but <u>results available on</u> <u>WMUR</u> at 95% of the count indicated a narrow win for Croft. **Current cases of Covid-19** in Warner: <u>at</u> <u>least 42 active, and a total of 60 overall</u>, no increase since last week.

COVID contact tracing scam: Kearsarge Regional School Board is warning of a new phone scam targeting parents of school age children. The caller pretends to be notifying you that your child has been exposed to a person who has tested positive for COVID-19 and then offers testing, and asks for credit card information etc. NEVER give out credit card or personal information to a caller unless you started the contact by calling a place you trust.

In Appreciation: Veterans

No matter which branch of the Armed Forces, what part of the world, home or abroad, or in which conflict or war you have served, **we thank all Veterans** for your service. I learned last November that Congress changed the law to include more veterans in eligibility for certain services, and also that any U.S. ARMED FORCES VETERAN that served Honorably on Active Duty starting with December 7, 1941 and going forward, is now eligible to join the <u>American Legion</u>.

Warner is host to the Wilkins-Cloues-Bigelow-Pearson American Legion Post 39. Click "Contact" at the top of their website <u>www.post39warnernh.org</u>/ to join or ask more questions. Tech Tip: No Windows Libby App!

News from OverDrive, the provider of <u>New</u> <u>Hampshire Downloadable Books</u>: they will discontinue support for the Libby app for Windows (but not for iOS or android).

Windows device users will still be able to use Libby features on their device by going

The Libby app will be removed from the Windows App Store the week of Dec. 7, 2020 to prevent any new users from installing the app.

OverDrive will provide in-app messaging to help impacted users with this transition. When users transition to the browser version, OverDrive will preserve as much of the reading data as possible, including saved libraries, library cards, and active to <u>libbyapp.com</u>. This site offers the same features as the app-store version of Libby, except the ability to download books for offline use. To access this functionality, users can download Libby for iOS or Android on a compatible device (iPhone, iPad, android smartphone or tablet, etc). loans and holds. Tags and historical timeline activity will not carry over to the browser.

If you are not using a Windows device to listen to or read digital books or magazines, this will not affect you.






