Governor Issues Emergency Mask Order

With rising cases of Covid 19 in NH, substantial statewide community transmission, and an increase in hospitalizations, today **Governor Chris Sununu signed an Emergency Order** instituting a **statewide mask mandate in New Hampshire**, as cases rose to 529 - the state's highest total to date. The mask mandate takes effect at 12:01 AM on **Friday**, **November 20, 2020, and will remain in effect through January 15, 2021**. Beginning on November 20, 2020, all persons over the age of 5 within the State of New Hampshire shall **wear mask or cloth face coverings** over their noses and mouths any time they are **in public spaces**, **indoors or outdoors**, where they are unable to or do not consistently maintain a physical distance of at least six feet from persons outside their own households.

Tech Tip: Contactless copies

At a Library Directors' Zoom meeting this week I heard advice for patrons with documents to copy, if they are not able to enter the library building or don't want their papers touched by others:

On phones and some other devices with

cameras, the Adobe Scan app enables you

Another tip: if you have a webpage, photo, or computer document to save or send, use the PRINT options to convert to a pdf that is easy to save or send, and which cannot be changed by the recipient.

When you choose "print", look to see if there is an option to "save as pdf", "print to pdf", or perhaps you have installed "doPdf", which is free and will show as a "printer".

Select that as your "printer" and then "print"

to make a pdf image of a document. This can then be emailed to your library staff or sent to the library's wireless printer from outside, for contactless printing (or just email it to whoever needs the copy). (or it may say "save") and you will be given a chance to name the file and to save it. You can even do this for important emails you want to save. Simply "print" as a pdf.

store.kearsargechamber.org. Notice of the winner will be posted on the KACC webpage and Facebook




