Ensuring Library Service During Covid

The Library Board and staff appreciate your patience with the new style of library use that has been developed to be able to continue providing all our usual services, during the Pandemic. If the building or the staff become exposed to the Coronavirus, many of those services would have to pause, so to ensure uninterrupted service, new routines and some new equipment have been added to protect the collections, the staff and the public. At this time, the public is not allowed in the building (except for necessary computer use by appointment), in order to ensure that ALL users feel able to safely borrow items from the library, and that there is adequate staffing to provide services.

Protecting the collection: items are returned in the book drop, and then set aside for 3 days before staff wipe them and check them in. We wear masks and sanitize hands before and after handling items coming in and going out. **Interlibrary loans** received from other libraries or lent out are also quarantined 3 days in both directions.

Protecting staff and the public: Staff wear masks at all times around others, and when working near the collection or packing books for pickup. Each person has a separate work station, computer and telephone. Bathrooms have been upgraded with touchless light/ fan switches and pedal trash receptacles. Staff training and meetings are conducted via Zoom, as are Trustee monthly and committee meetings, which are open to the public.

iWave bipolar ionization units have been installed in the air system. These add charged ions to the air, which attach to particles, helping to remove/ reduce virus and allergens, protecting people and keeping collections clean.

Public computer use is allowed by appointment, for short periods (with masks), or a chromebook can be borrowed. **Copies** can be handled by email, sent by wifi from your device to our printers, or if necessary, curbside service (call or ring the doorbell).

Adult and Children's programs are being held by Zoom, and "Take and Make" craft activities will available starting in December.

Museum passes, online resources and assistance with selecting books are available by phone or email. Instruction in using Zoom or any of our resources is available on request. It can even be done via Zoom!

Packaged books waiting for curbside pickup, Requests made by placing holds in the catalog or by email or phone are found, checked out, and packed for next-day pickup.


KRSD will be doing remote learning for all classes for the 2 weeks following Thanksgiving break.

EBSCOhost is a searchable source of magazine and journal articles, many in full text and/or pdf image format.

Other articles not available as full text in EBSCO are also shown in your search, and can be requested through your friendly neighborhood librarians (Hellooo!).

Explora is a kid friendly article search tool in EBSCO, with age-appropriate results.

To Search EBSCOhost you will need to sign in, using your library card number (yes, that annoying 14 digit number). Starting from our website homepage or the library catalog is an easy way to find the sign in page.

Novelist and Novelist K-8 are also EBSCO products accessed using the same ID. These are great for finding series order or genre suggestions, Discussion questions, and more. Select them at login.






