

Financial Relief during the Pandemic

Beginning January 20, 2021, **New Hampshire Legal Assistance** (NHLA) and the Legal Advice and Referral Center (LARC) will hold free online **weekly help sessions for tenants facing eviction**. NO SIGN UP NECESSARY

During these Eviction Clinics, legal aid attorneys and paralegals will explain tenants' rights during an eviction, and answer questions. They cannot provide legal advice for specific cases at the clinics.

WHEN: Every Wednesday, from 7-8:30 PM and every other Wednesday, from 2-3:30 PM via Zoom.

Warner's **MadgeTech** company President, Norm Carlson, is working closely with Governor Chris Sununu to transport the COVID-19 vaccine into the state, and monitor distribution according to the Governor's plan.

Tech Tips: Inter-Library Loan


Some of you may have missed the news that the NH Inter-library Loan (ILL) service restarted in October 2020. Strict protocols are being followed statewide for quarantining the materials before and after transportation by the State's library van service, which means it usually takes two weeks before you can pick up your requested item.

Be aware that most libraries do not lend items they have owned less than 6 months.

To request books, audio CDs, DVD videos, magazines or articles:

- 1. Check <u>our catalog</u> to be sure we don't already own it.
- 2. Request the book by phone 456-2289, website <u>ILL contact form</u>, or email.
- 3. We will contact you about it, if we have questions or if it is not available or too new.
- 4. If it is available, you should get a call to pick up within 2 weeks. Call if not.
- 5. We also welcome suggestions for items to add to our collection.




