

### **Tech Tips: New Languages Online**

Transparent Language Online, the Language learning program the Library subscribes to for Warner, has made a recent change in hosting platform, so returning users will notice a change in the look of the sign-in page and you might need to perform a password reset in order to gain access to your account and your learning history. This is a one-time password reset.

New users must provide your library card number to sign up, then create an account with your email and any password of your choice.

There is now a handy **Transparent Language Online** app for android or iOS devices to learn anywhere, any time. Find it in your Apple or Play app store.



Progress is tracked in your account and synced in the app for easy access to your next lessons, no matter how long it has been between sessions. If you have paused for a while, it even offers to "refresh stale vocabulary" with a review practice session.






