# Libraries reopening... slowly

The Library Trustees are starting *Discussions* about reopening our library. Factors to consider, in addition to watching the progress of new COVID variants, include the general vaccination schedule and availability; maximum occupancy guidelines for distancing, traffic flow, and rearranging furnishings for distancing; temporary removal of toys; and setting up signage and safe procedures for the transitional stage of public access. If we also continue offering pickup service, then adequate staffing and space use for packed away items are additional factors.

Most likely we will begin with controlled entry, limited numbers, and short visit times, possibly some time in May. Quarantining of returned items, distancing, and mask wearing will continue. Stay tuned!

#### **Tech Tips: Downloadable Books**

If you are struggling with downloading your OverDrive ebooks or audiobooks on certain devices, there is a new easy option to use if your device can browse the Internet: try libbyapp.com.

This is the web-version of the *Libby for OverDrive* app, ideal for access if you cannot use the app itself, such as for a Windows laptop, or certain tablets, Kindle Fire, or Apple /Mac devices.

If you can use apps we recommend Libby!

#### Placing holds (Redux)

We have had several recent calls about how to place a request for an item through our catalog. The Cart confuses people!

- 1. Find a book in the catalog
- 2. Place a HOLD (and confirm the hold)
- 3. Staff will let you know when to pick up your items. **Simple as that**.

DO NOT try to "send" the request for items put in your cart (or in a list). Just place a HOLD if you want to borrow the item(s). You CAN place a hold on all or selected items in your cart if you wish.


