The malicious email contains a link which sends users to a website which tells the victim to click on a photo to see proof. If they click the photo, they actually download Trickbot onto their system.

Bills and committee hearings of interest

Monday March 29 9 am <u>Legislative Administration Committee</u> will discuss <u>a group of Bills</u> "relative to termination of an emergency order issued by the governor" Tuesday March 30 <u>Commerce and Consumer Affairs</u>: includes

10:00 a.m. **SB 68**, requiring an employer to provide reasonable accommodations for pregnant employees.

10:30 a.m. **SB 69-FN**, requiring employers to provide access to a sufficient space for nursing mothers and reasonable break time.

<u>Labor, Industrial and rehabilitative services</u>: 9:00 a.m. Executive Session on **SB 61**, prohibiting collective bargaining agreements that require employees to join a labor union. ("Right to Work" legislation).




