**Keep your voter registration active!** Voter Checklist Verification - 04/10/21 9:00 - 9:30 AM Warner Town Hall New Hampshire law requires that the Supervisors of the Checklist verify the checklist every ten years. Any person on the checklist who has not voted in the past four years must re-register to remain on the checklist. The Supervisors are sending notice letters to those voters at the address the voter provided when registering. They will hold a session for reregistering voters who have not voted since April 1, 2017, new voter registration, correction of the Checklist, and/or change of political party affiliation on: Saturday, April 10, 2021, 9-9:30 a.m. Voters may check party affiliation on-line:






