

Health Care Insurance for \$0 - \$10/mo?

You May Qualify For New Discounts in Affordable Health Care Plans

(From <u>www.npr.org/sections/health-shots/2021/04/22/989448586/</u>) Due to the Covid-19 emergency, for several groups of people, it's possible to enroll or reenroll in **health coverage, for zero dollars** in monthly premiums. Many more — the federal government estimates <u>four out of every five enrollees</u> — qualify for plans with **premiums of \$10 or less** per month. Others can save up to \$200 on monthly premiums. **You may even be able to change over to the new discounts if you are already enrolled in a plan.**

You can sign up for these newly discounted plans on all Affordable Care Act marketplaces, including <u>Healthcare.gov</u>, **until August 15, 2021**. What's also different now is that people with no monthly premiums also can get better,

more comprehensive "silver" plans.

- Anyone earning less than 150% of the poverty line which is around \$19,000 a year if you're single, or around \$39,000 a year for a family of four pays nothing for the benchmark silver plan, Silver plans cover about 70% of your health care costs compared to 60% for bronze plans.
- Another group that can get zero dollar plans is people who lost a job with health care benefits in the last year and couldn't afford COBRA premiums the program for continuing an employer-based insurance plan after a layoff. Thanks to these subsidies, they can now get 100% of their COBRA premium paid for at least through September, and be credited for premiums paid while unemployed. Department of Labor FAQ






