Memorial Day Services

Members and Veterans will meet at the Legion Hall at 10:30 AM to pick up gear for the Color Detail and the Firing Squad. We will leave for the Cemetery by 11.00 AM.

Post 39 participants will then drive and/or ride to the Pine Grove Cemetery for the presentation of a prayer and salute and then proceed to the Warner River for another prayer and salute in remembrance for Veterans that perished at Sea. The Legion Detail will then return to the Legion Hall to stow all gear be dismissed.

All persons that wish are welcome to attend this event. Hopefully we may be able to conduct the Memorial Day Exercises next year as we have for more than 100 years.

There will be no event at the Town Hall due to COVID-19. The Kearsarge Regional High School Band will also not be coming for any activities in Warner.



Once you are registered for the SYNC program you can use Sora, the student reading app from OverDrive! You don't need to be affiliated with a school to use Sora with the SYNC program.

How do you set up Sora?

- 1. Download Sora from the <u>Apple App Store</u>or <u>Google Play Store</u>, or go to soraapp.com in your browser.
- 2. In Sora, tap "I have a setup code" (at the bottom of the screen).
- 3. Enter this setup code: audiobooksync.
- 4. Enter the email address you used to sign up for SYNC.
- 5. Tap Explore (at the bottom of the screen) to see the week's featured titles. There are two titles available to download each week, and you have plenty of time to listen to them later, but must download them during that week.

On Tuesday May 18, the Library Board of Trustees voted to aim for **reopening the library to brief in-person browsing around June 28, 2021**. The decision is based on low levels of local Covid-19 cases, increasing vaccination levels, and waiting for completion of a **floor refinishing project which is scheduled for Mid June**. The floor project will require moving furniture and shelves.
