

# I-89 Night Roadwork

There will be **nighttime lane closures** on Interstate-89 in Hopkinton for the next **10 weeks** as the New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDOT) will repair the Jewett Road Bridge. Work was set to begin Monday, May 17.

The overpass is located just south of Exit 4 and all lanes on I-89 will be open during the day.

The Exit 4 southbound on-ramp will be closed during the nighttime hours when crews are working on that end of the bridge. Motorists will be detoured to the I-89 on-ramp at Exit 2 via NH Route 9/202 and the Langley Parkway (6.5 miles). Detour signs and message boards will be used to direct motorists.

During the work on the Jewett Road bridge over I-89, the local traffic will be limited to one lane of alternating two-way traffic using temporary traffic signals.


