

Sean Toomey now NH Fire Marshall

On June 2, the NH Executive Council unanimously confirmed the appointment of **Sean P. Toomey** as State Fire Marshall. The announcement says "Marshal Toomey of Warner, NH, most recently served as Deputy State Fire Marshal since 2018 and a chief officer with the Warner, NH Fire Department since 2012.

Marshal Toomey is a licensed fire protection engineer since 2003 and attained his firefighter certification in 2004 as a call firefighter with the Goffstown Fire Department. He has extensive training and experience in building safety, fire codes



and fire investigations. Marshal Toomey will manage the Division of Fire Safety and is responsible for overseeing fire investigations, fire safety regulations, coordinating state agency response to hazardous materials incidents, modular building standards and providing support to the State Board of Fire Control."

COVID updates and vaccine info


Current cases of Covid-19 in Warner: 0 <u>active cases</u>, with a total of 202 cases so far, an increase of zero from last week's newsletter. Keep up the good work!

NH COVID vaccination Information <u>vaccines.nh.gov</u> or call 211. **Drop-ins** are now allowed at some sites daily **3-6 pm Mon-Sat**.

Good news! As of June 2, the 7 day average number of new NH cases was down 40% compared to the previous 7 days, and is close to the levels of March 2020 according to https://www.covid19.nh.gov/ a source of various NH COVID-19 information.

Did you know **cabbage moths** are territorial?

Library Assistant **Linda Lacasse** found this suggestion to prevent cabbage moth caterpillars - scare the moths away with imitation moths! A **printable Moth decoy** page is available at

goodseedco.net/blog/posts/cabbage-butterfly-decoy. or make your own! Linda says: I cut them out, put them back to back and slide a piece of string in between. Use packing tape to seal them, then tie string to a stick.





On Tuesday May 18, the Library Board of Trustees voted to aim for **reopening the library to brief in-person browsing around June 28, 2021**. The decision is based on low levels of local Covid-19 cases, increasing vaccination levels, and waiting for completion of a **floor refinishing project which is scheduled for Mid June**. The floor project will require moving furniture and shelves.
