Library Receives ARPA Funds





The Pillsbury Free Library is the recipient of \$1322 in grant funding thanks to federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds and made possible by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) and the New Hampshire State Library in a first round of mini grants to NH libraries. The funds received will support the Pillsbury Free Library's efforts to provide information to residents and access to services, such as children's programs held in new ways due to the COVID 19 pandemic.

Using these grant funds, the library has purchased a sound system (microphone, mixer and speakers) and a 10 x 20 ft canopy for outdoor, distanced programs, (see photos) and has repaired two outdoor informational signs (photo below). Grant funds will also support the **printing** of this weekly community newsletter and book lists, for people unable to receive it by email.

COVID News to Use

Did you know headache and sneezing without fever could now be a sign of Covid? In Europe, the list of the top five Covid symptoms has changed over time, due to variants and depending on vaccination status. According to a UK research group following symptoms since March 2020, **in fully vaccinated people** the **top three symptoms** of infection with the Covid virus are now **headache**, **runny nose and sneezing**, while cough and fever are much less common. (Could this be why the Delta variant is so much more contagious?) https://covid.joinzoe.com/post/new-top-5-covid-symptoms

In the USA, Massachusetts General Hospital and other health organizations partnered with the original UK group for monitoring COVID statistics and research in the US, including how diet, hormones and other factors affect immunity. https://covid.joinzoe.com/us/blog. (It does not appear to be as up to date as the UK site.)

Current cases of Covid-19 in Warner: 0 active cases, with a total of 203 cases so far, an increase of zero from last three week's newsletters. Keep up the good work! The virus is still surging in much of the world, and cases of the more contagious and serious Delta variant in NH are increasing (12% rise in total NH Covid-19 cases in past week).

On Tuesday May 18, the Library Board of Trustees voted to **reopen the library to brief in-person browsing on June 28, 2021, with masks required for now.** The decision is based on low levels of local Covid-19 cases, and increasing vaccination levels.


