Financial News to Use

Recently the Pro Bono Program and the Legal Advice and Referral Center merged to become **603 Legal Aid**. Not all the programs' websites have been updated to reflect the changes. For example, the Domestic Violence Emergency project (DOVE) is now under 603 Legal Aid but the website says it's under Pro Bono. Current cases of Covid-19 in **Warner**: **0** <u>active cases</u>, with a **total of 203 cases so far**, an increase of **zero** from last three week's newsletters. Keep up the good work! 


