

Current cases of Covid-19 in Warner: 0 active cases, with a total of 203 cases reported so far, an increase of zero from last three week's newsletters. Cases of the more contagious and serious Delta variant in NH are increasing. Please consider wearing masks indoors in public to protect the 21% of our population who are

under 12 years old who cannot be vaccinated yet, and others.



This August 2021 marks the 35th anniversary of Art Spiegelman's Maus, which is as much a publishing industry landmark as it is a reminder of the evils of Nazism.

Maus helped transform mainstream opinion of the graphic novel from "mere" comic book to serious work of art. In the book, Spiegelman uses anthropomorphic animals--Jews as mice, Germans as cats and Poles as pigs--to tell the story of his parents during the Holocaust.

In 1992, Maus became the first graphic novel to win a Pulitzer

Prize.




