On August 3, 2021, the Selectboard voted to require masks in Town buildings. Town Hall is open for walk-in business. All meetings are in person. Maintain social distancing. Audience chairs will be 6 feet apart. After the meeting, groups should clean their tables using Clorox wipes which will be available.





NH Law Librarian Mary Searles has created a web page, about **Temporary Protection from Eviction Effective Aug. 3, 2021 through October 3, 2021** which has information about the extension—for **some tenants**—of the eviction moratorium. https://courts-state-nh-us.libguides.com/c.php?g=889667&p=7993705&preview=08c96d8f05745593f97ca5626f079ee3

The very important change to note is that this version of the moratorium ONLY covers tenants who are living in counties who are experiencing substantial to high transmission of COVID-19. So far Merrimack county is not one of them, but six other NH counties are.

The CDC recently changed its mask guidelines for vaccinated people, recommending mask use indoors, especially in areas with higher infection numbers. https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/fully-vaccinated-guidance.html

Cases of the more contagious and serious **Delta variant in NH are increasing but only hospitalized cases and deaths are being reported. SIX NH Counties are now considered a "substantial risk"** area. View risk ratings and vaccination levels by county at https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view Please consider wearing masks indoors in public to protect the 21% of our population who are under 12 years old who cannot be vaccinated yet, and others.

Symptoms in vaccinated people can resemble colds: headache, runny nose and sneezing are the new top reported symptoms. covid.joinzoe.com/post/new-top-5-covid-symptoms.




