COVID News to Use

<u>All</u> N.H. counties are now considered "HIGH level of transmission" areas for Covid due to the Delta variant. View risk ratings and vaccine levels by county at https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view.

Market Basket is "strongly recommending" masks for customers, and all employees are required to wear them.

Warner and surrounding towns are seeing new cases again.(3 more in Warner this week: total 208) <u>www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#</u>. Note that ONLY unvaccinated cases are being reported in NH statistics.

Symptoms in vaccinated people can **resemble colds**: see the new top reported symptoms <u>covid.joinzoe.com/post/new-top-5-covid-symptoms</u>, with detailed descriptions like this: "Having a **headache (usually lasting more than a day)** is a very common symptom of COVID-19 for all age groups. On average, around seven in ten adults who are ill with COVID-19 will have a headache. It's slightly less common in children, affecting around six in ten children. Around 15% of people who were ill with COVID-19 reported a headache as their ONLY symptom."

Town by Town vaccination data: Warner: 62.80% with at least 1 dose; 59.30% fully vaccinated. <u>www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-vaccine-nh-town/37373063</u>. Remember that about 20% are under 12 and therefore ineligible: NY Times vaccination maps for Merrimack County show 98% of people over 65 have been fully vaccinated, 70% of those over 18 yrs old, and 68% over age 12.

To get a COVID -19 vaccine: <u>vaccines.nh.gov</u> or call 211. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE, and available for ages 12 and up.

The CDC recommends pregnant people to get vaccinated against Covid-19. The Delta variant is now known to cause severe danger to mother and baby. https://www.nbcnews.com/health/health-news/covid-icus-doctors-see-surge-critically-ill-pregnant-women-n1277524

NH's mobile vaccination van will be at NHTI, Concord's Community College from 2 - 8 PM on August 27th. The van is available upon request for any size group across the State of New Hampshire at no cost. All three types of vaccine are available. www.covid19.nh.gov/request-mobile-vaccination-van


Borrow a nature bag! Woodland Wonders


TEEN TALK by Linda
