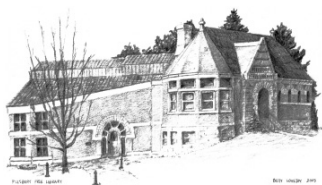

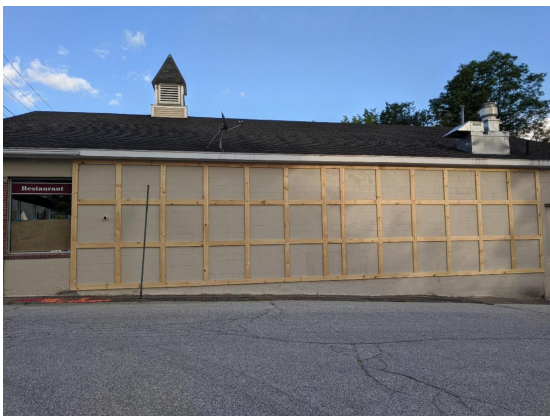
We ask for a minimum of a two-hour commitment. **Each volunteer is rewarded with a tee shirt as a thank you.** Students are eligible for community service hours.

COVID News to Use

NIH launches **study of extra COVID-19 vaccine dose** in people with autoimmune disease. Trial also will test pausing immunosuppressive medication to improve antibody response. www.nih.gov/news-events/news-releases/nih-launches-study-extra-covid-19-vaccine-dose-people-autoimmune-disease

All N.H. counties are now considered "HIGH level of transmission" areas for Covid due to the Delta variant, except Coos, which is back to "substantial". View risk ratings and vaccine levels by county at <https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view>. The 7-day average of **new cases rose almost 24%** in Merrimack county this week, and new cases tripled in Warner (from 3 new to 10 new).

Warner and surrounding towns are seeing new cases again. (10 more in Warner this week: total 218) www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#. Note that we are not sure if this includes "breakthrough" vaccinated cases.

"In the early days of the pandemic, it was thought that having a **runny nose** was not a symptom of COVID-19, and was much more likely to be a sign of a regular cold. However, data from the ZOE COVID Symptom Study app suggests that having a runny nose can be a sign of COVID-19. "

Town by Town vaccination data in our School District :

(Remember, about 20% of Warner's residents are under 12 and therefore ineligible):

Warner: 62.90% with at least 1 dose; 59.30% fully vaccinated.

Wilmot: 65.50% / 60.60% fully vaccinated

Sutton: 40.70% / 38.30% fully vaccinated

Springfield: 51.70% / 48.20% fully vaccinated

Newbury: 64.80% / 60.70% fully vaccinated

New London: 79.10% / 73.80% fully vaccinated

Bradford: 69.70% / 64.50% fully vaccinated

[NY Times vaccination maps](#) for **Merrimack County** show 98% of people over 65 have been fully vaccinated, 70% of those over 18 yrs old, and 68% over age 12.

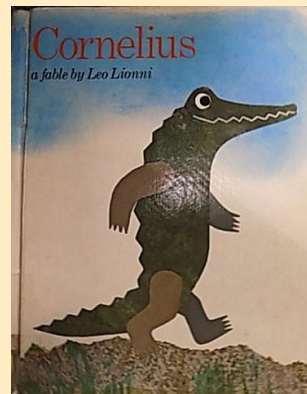

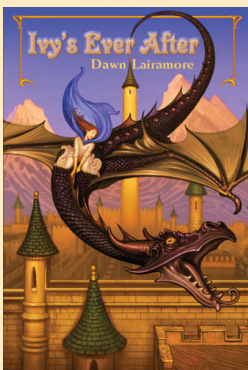

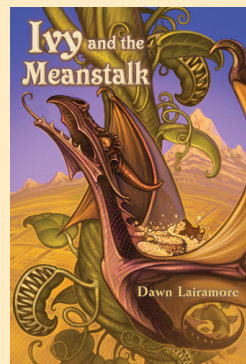

Library Trustees' Meetings

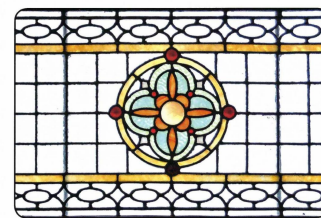
