Recent Grants



From Warner Town Administrator Diane Ricciardelli: "Congratulations to the Director of Public Works, Tim Allen, and a strong grant team, on receiving two grant awards totaling \$213,123 for the Ballard Brook Culvert Restoration project as part of the Warner River Connectivity Project.

The Town of Warner (Department of Public Works, Conservation Commission, and Emergency Management Department) has been working with multiple agencies to plan and implement culvert replacements, and looks forward to completing Phase I of

this project. The initial phase includes the replacement of the northern most pipe on Red Chimney and to have plans (with design in place) for two additional culverts: one on Red Chimney and one on East Joppa.

The grant amounts are 165k, an Aquatic Resource Mitigation (ARM) grant from the Department of Environmental Services (DES), and \$48,213 from New Hampshire Fish and Wildlife grant through the Merrimack River Watershed Council.

Town vaccination data: Warner's numbers are unchanged since last week (Remember, about 20% of Warner's residents are under 12 and therefore ineligible): Warner: 62.90% with at least 1 dose; 59.30% fully vaccinated www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-vaccine-nh-town/37373063.

NY Times vaccination maps for **Merrimack County** show 98% of people over 65 have been fully vaccinated, 70% of those over 18 yrs old, and 68% over age 12.




