Milkweed for Monarchs

Did you know that the disappearance of milkweed across the U.S. has contributed to the 80% decline of the **eastern monarch butterfly** population over the last 20 years? Now, there's a way for you to help! NH Fish and Game and UNH Cooperative Extension need you to help collect common milkweed pods and drop them in collection bins from **Sept. 15** - **Oct. 30**. The seeds from the pods will be sown by NH Department of Transportation into conservation corridors, designated areas along highways that are planted with native perennials to benefit pollinators. The Library can be a drop-off for pods, if a volunteer will take them to a collection site.



Only collect the pods when they are dry and grey/brown. If the center seam pops with gentle pressure, they can be harvested...



When green they are not mature or ready to collect.

Leave some pods (25%) on the plants to also allow for natural dispersal in your area.

Dialing 603 Required Soon

Reminder: ON October 24, 2021 Callers in New Hampshire will be required to dial the 3-

digit area code 603 when making local calls, to prepare for next July's rollout of the 988 <u>National Suicide Prevention Lifeline</u>. Why? The "988" number also happens to be a local exchange in many states, including New Hampshire.

The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline is currently **1-800-273-TALK** (1-800-273-8255). Starting July 16, 2022, those in crisis will also be able to dial 988

Remember to change programmed speed dials in **alarms**, and home or business phone systems (but we hear cell phones are different), to the 10 digit format that includes 603. Well Water Testing Made Easy(er)

There is still time to sign up for the "Private Well Water" Testing Workshop presented by the NH Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) on Wednesday, Sept. 29, 2021 at 6:30 pm in the meeting room of the library (masks required). [Yes, this is the same night as the Historical Society program - Sorry! Limited choices. You can sign up for a sample kit and form anyway - or attend briefly and switch over!] The workshop, for residents of Warner and neighboring towns, will cover why well users should get their water tested; the most common contaminants, and the associated health risks; how to get your water tested; how to understand what your test results mean, and


Water test kits with forms will be available for pickup at the library during the event, and on the next day for those who <u>let us know</u> they want a kit, but cannot attend.

Register online at www.facebook.com/pillsburyfreelibrary/events or by calling or emailing the Pillsbury Free Library; even if you only want a test kit. (You are not required to have your water tested, even if you take a kit home.) The sample submission form can be viewed here: https://www.warner.lib.nh.us/wp-content/uploads/2021/09/water-testing-guide.pdf but you will also need their standard sample bottles. If you will need help paying for the test, please call WarnerConnects at 603-456-2053.

Save travel time by dropping off your collected water samples in Warner on Sunday, October 17, with a check to NHDES for the testing requested, and completed test forms. A library Trustee will drive all the samples to the NH DES lab in Concord the next morning for testing. Or you can deliver your test kit to DES yourself. Kits with samples for Bacteria testing must be delivered within 24 hours of samples being taken. Results are mailed to YOU.

Town vaccination data: Warner's numbers are same as last week (Remember, about 20% of Warner's residents are under 12 and therefore ineligible):

Warner: 63.30% with at least 1 dose; 59.50% fully vaccinated—www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-vaccine-nh-town/37373063.

NY Times vaccination maps for **Merrimack County** show 98.2% of people over 65 have been fully vaccinated, 71.4% of those over 18 yrs old, and 69.5% over age 12.

To get a COVID-19 vaccine: <u>vaccines.nh.gov</u> or call 211. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE, and available for ages 12 and up.

NH's mobile vaccination van schedule is posted on the DHHS FB every week. There will be a drive-through vaccination session at Kearsarge Regional Middle School on Friday, October 1, 4 to 6 pm.





Library Trustees' Meetings


