## **Art, Music and History**




The Warner Mural was installed and unveiled last weekend on the wall of Reeds North restaurant, which will be opening later this month.

The unveiling of the **Black Heritage Trail of NH Historical marker** on Sunday Oct. 3 was a big success in spite of rain. Participants included the Wilkins-Cloues-Bigelow-Pearson Post #39 of the American Legion, Don Wheeler from the Sons of Union Veterans & trumpeter Lois Sturtevant who honored Warner's Black veterans with a 21 gun + musket salute followed by taps. Jane Wescomb & Harvey Keye did the unveiling & Selectman Sam Bower & Rep. Becky Whitley gave speeches. This was followed by a Black history walking tour, for which Alan Lord set up the sound system at each stop. JerriAnne Boggis of the Black Heritage Trail of NH is a key person behind raising awareness of NH's Black history, often in coordination with Warner Historical Society.



# Tech Tips: Older iPads, EBSCO

As of Friday, Oct. 1, 2021 some users with older electronic devices are no longer able to use the Libby app or access <u>NH Downloadable Books</u> on those devices. Here is the quickest way to check if the iPad is incompatible:

- · Open the Settings app
- Tap General
- · Tap About
- View the Software Version or Version

If the software version is 9.x or lower, the device is no longer compatible. You can try updating the device, but if device states that the software is already up to date, there is no more to be done to resolve the issue.




