He sold out by 10:30 am due to the unexpected (and hungry) crowd! There was an extended Historical Society barn sale, and

To get a COVID-19 vaccine: <u>vaccines.nh.gov</u> or call 211. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE, and available for ages 12 and up, Pfizer boosters available for over 65 or high risk/immune compromised people.

NH's mobile vaccination van <u>schedule is posted on the DHHS FB page every week</u> Commissioner Shibinette announced **4 #covid19 public testing centers will open** in the state as part of a partnership with <u>ClearChoiceMD Urgent Care</u>. Two are opening this week with the other two opening next week.

NOT a scam: COVID calls from DHHS: "As part of a quality assurance review regarding COVID-19 vaccinations, DHHS is currently calling several people in the state to confirm the details we have on file regarding their COVID-19 vaccine to ensure they have the ability to view and print their COVID-19 vaccination information."

<u>All</u> N.H. counties are currently considered "HIGH level of transmission" areas for Covid due to the Delta variant, View risk ratings and vaccine levels by county at <u>https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view</u>.



Library Trustees' Meetings




