Warner's new cases: (18 more since last Thursday, 23 active in Warner this week: total 353). Due to a glitch in the NH reporting system, WMUR says numbers since October 22 are still not fully entered in the system, so the recent totals are possibly still too low. www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#.

Town vaccination data: This is only approximate: definition of "complete" is shifting to mean 3 doses...and some data is not included. <a href="www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-vaccine-nh-town/37373063">www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-vaccine-nh-town/37373063</a>.

As of November 24: % of Merrimack Co. over 12 Years old at least one dose: 95.2%. Fully vaccinated: 72.7%.

To get a COVID-19 vaccine: <u>vaccines.nh.gov</u> or call 211. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE, and available for ages 5 and up, Pfizer and Moderna boosters are available for anyone over 18, six months or more after their second dose.

The December 2021 Library Trustees' Monthly meeting is cancelled unless an urgent reason arises to meet.


