The Free at-home Covid -19 test kits were all spoken for within 24 hours of DHHS posting the link! The State dashboard now has a link to the page for the "Booster Blitz" for making appointments for booster shots. (see also news above about two clinics in the Warner area this weekend)

<u>All</u> N.H. counties are currently considered "HIGH level of transmission" areas for Covid due to the Delta variant, View risk ratings and vaccine levels by county at <u>https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view</u>.


