Winter driving! On December 11 around 7:58 am #Trooper Jacob Plourde was assisting at a crash scene on Interstate 89 northbound in Warner. At that time a vehicle lost control and struck his cruiser. Both the cruiser and the other vehicle were damaged but neither Trooper Plourde or the driver of the other vehicle were injured. There was freezing rain falling at the time and the roadway was ice covered. **All drivers are asked to be particularly mindful of their speed during inclement weather.**

Drivers are also asked to be aware of the **#moveover law** which requires motorists to give emergency vehicles a wide berth. This includes police and fire vehicles as well as tow trucks, DOT trucks, and any other kind of service vehicle with blue, red, or yellow flashing lights.

Kearsarge Area After School Ski and Snowboard Club starts in January




