replacement is made of **steel** and comes with a 20 year warranty. The cost of this is \$108,445.75, which would be raised through taxation.



Library Trustees' News



A \$12,598 grant has been awarded to Pillsbury Free Library through an Institute for Museum and Library Services' (IMLS) "Grants to States" program that is part of the American Rescue Act Plan (ARPA) of 2021 and that is being facilitated by the N.H. State Library. The funds will be used for the purchase and installation of two Poppinpod Om Sit booths, for

privacy while having online or phone conversations aloud in the library. This American Rescue Plan Act Grant is administered by the Institute for Museum and Library Services (IMLS).

A **Public hearing** will be held by the Trustees of the Pillsbury Free Library prior to formally accepting the funds, as required by NH RSA for acceptance of unanticipated funds of \$5000 or greater, at the monthly meeting on Tuesday January 18, at 7 pm.

Library Trustee committees meetings include the Monthly Board Meeting on the third Tuesday of each month (at 6:30 pm, in person now), and various Committee meetings, some that meet monthly, vary in time.

Trustee meetings are published 24-48 hours in advance on the <u>Warner Events Calendar</u>. Approved minutes are published on the <u>Trustee Meetings page</u>.
