

You may receive a text message containing a link to a fraudulent website, "New Hampshire Covid-19 Vaccine Status Validation". The goal in this scam is for the receiver of the text message to enter personal information to include social security number, date of birth, and to upload images of their driver's license. They have incorporated both NH Department of Health and Human Services and NH Department of Motor Vehicles seals in an attempt to appear legitimate.

"Fun Fact": In Warner about 1 in 6.5 residents (452/2937) has now had Covid 19 so far - if each person only had it once. National average is 1 in 5.6 (58.5M / 330M) as of 1/07/22.

All N.H. counties are **"HIGH level of transmission"** areas, View risk ratings and vaccine levels by county at https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view.

NH Dept. of Infectious Diseases has updated their guidance document for **isolation and quarantine**, based on new CDC guidelines: They say if you are fully vaccinated and have been exposed, wear a mask for ten days around others and get tested after 5, but no need to quarantine unless symptomatic or test is positive. Anyone who has tested positive needs to isolate for 5 days and mask for 5 days more (after any fever is gone or test is negative). https://www.covid19.nh.gov/sites/g/files/ehbemt481/files/inline-documents/sonh/isolation-and-quarantine-recommendations 0.pdf





Library Trustees' News

Interested in being involved in the library as a Board member? One of the three Library Trustees up for renewal this March is not renewing. Monthly meetings are on Tuesdays, and there are optional committees to choose from. Upcoming Library projects include planning/implementing a new HVAC system, and implementing grants received for computers and other technology, as well as ongoing community program planning, fundraising, and policy updates. Sign up to be on the ballot at the Town Clerk's office between January 19 and 28, 2022, for elections in March.



Reminder: A **Public hearing** will be held by the Trustees of the Pillsbury Free Library at the monthly meeting on Tuesday January 18, at 7 pm, as required by NH RSA for acceptance of unanticipated funds of \$5000 or greater.

A \$12,598 grant has been awarded to Pillsbury Free Library through an Institute for Museum and Library Services' (IMLS) "Grants to States" program that is part of the American Rescue Act Plan (ARPA) of 2021 and that is being facilitated by the N.H. State Library.

The funds will be used for the purchase and installation of two <u>Poppinpod Om Sit booths</u>, for privacy while having online or phone conversations aloud in the library. This American Rescue Plan Act Grant is administered by the Institute for Museum and Library Services (IMLS).

Library Trustee committees meetings include the Monthly Board Meeting on the third Tuesday of each month (at 6:30 pm, in person now), and various Committee meetings, some that meet monthly, vary in time.


