Free PCR TESTING kits for NH households that did not get the NH free rapid tests, from https://learn.vaulthealth.com/nh/ These are saliva PCR tests which are done in front of Zoom video, sent in, and results sent 1-2 days after the sample is received.


Thank you to those who have responded to our 2021 Annual fund drive. Letters were
