Can you believe it? In the small town of Monroeville, Alabama, during the 1930s, lived two children. One was a small boy with a high voice, a fancy jacket, and short trousers. The other was a girl who was as tough as any boy and who protected her little friend. Their bond lasted a life time, and they became two of the greatest American writers of the 20th Century: Truman Capote (In Cold Blood) and Harper Lee (To Kill a Mockingbird).

Author G. Neri has written a book (for young readers) called <u>Tru & Nelle</u>, which tells a story inspired by Tru and Nelle's early friendship. <u>Neri has made a wonderful 9 minute film of Tru and Nelle and Monroeville</u>, which takes readers of all ages back to the roots of these two famous writers.


