FREE at- home rapid tests now available from https://www.covidtests.gov/ Soon there will also be tests available to buy at NH Liquor stores, and Insurance companies are being told to cover a set number of test kits per month - check with your insurance to find if they are supplying tests or reimbursing for your purchases.

Also coming in February, free N95 masks at some pharmacies, possibly 3 per visit.


Wake by Lisa McMann


Wake is the first part of Lisa McMann's *Wake Trilogy*, followed by *Fade* and *Gone*.
