## **COVID News**

Warner's new cases *reported*: 1 more since last Thursday, 1-4 active as of 03/17/22. Total so far 618. <u>www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#</u>. Note that positive Home tests are often not added to the system.

#### CDC data

**Merrimack County** is now currently rated as **LOW** risk by the <u>CDC County Check Tool</u> (based on **hospitalizations and deaths, not total cases**). "People may choose to mask at any time. People with symptoms, a positive test, or exposure to someone with COVID-19 should wear a mask."

On the CDC covid-19 data tracker site <u>https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view</u> it shows Merrimack county as: "Community Transmission - Moderate," a reduction from Substantial last week.

**FREE at- home rapid tests available from**<u>https://www.covidtests.gov/</u> are still available. **A second order is now allowed.** Tests are also available to buy at NH Liquor stores, and Insurance companies should cover a set number of test kits per month - check with your insurance to find if they are supplying tests or reimbursing for your purchases. **Medicare** also covers kits.

Also available: **free N95 masks** at some major pharmacies, 3 per visit. **Federal mask mandates** for public transportation (bus, train, air) has been **extended to mid April**.

# Joan Didion - a Strong, Clear Voice by Roger Robbins

Joan Didion wrote in a sparse, honest style unique to her. 


