COVID News

Covid 19 cases are creeping up again including hospitalizations. Luckily, Merrimack County is currently rated as LOW risk by the <u>CDC County Check Tool</u> (based on hospitalizations and deaths, not total cases). "People with symptoms, a positive test, or exposure to someone with COVID-19 should wear a mask."

NH Counties are back up to MEDIUM and Grafton and Sullivan are at HIGH

Community Transmission risk. Merrimack and Belknap counties are still at " Low."

Warner's new cases *reported*: 2 since last Thursday, 1-4 active as of 5/5/22. Total so far 632. www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#. Note positive home tests are not included.

Free N95 masks are available at some major pharmacies, 3 per visit.

If you have health insurance through an employer or Marketplace, your insurance will pay you back for 8 at-home tests each month for each person on your plan.

<u>More about insurance reimbursement</u>. In NH, pop-up testing sites closed in March but you can arrange for a test through your Doctor's office.

FREE at- home rapid tests available from https://www.covidtests.gov/ are still available. A second order is allowed. Tests can also be bought at NH Liquor stores.

To get a COVID-19 vaccine: <u>vaccines.nh.gov</u> or call 211. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE, and available for ages 5 and up. Second boosters available for ages 50+.

NH fixed vaccination sites include Concord, 8 am to 2 pm every day .








Storytimes with Miss Sue, every Thursday at 10:30 am - stories, songs, fingerplays, and a craft. It's back to being held in the Children's room.



Library Hours Changed!

Tuesday evening Library hours return! For those who have trouble getting back from work in time or just like to come out after supper to use the library, we now **staying open until 8 pm on Tuesdays** (but not Thursdays) as of May 3. To keep within budgeted hours, however, we have **dropped the Wednesday morning hours** (now opening at 1 pm) - but keeping Monday mornings, 10 am to noon, for now.

Covid protocols at the Library: We are no longer holding returned items in quarantine, so they can be returned inside when we are open, instead of placing them in the Book Drop slot outside. **Masks are now optional but encouraged**, during library visits unless/until Covid numbers rise again. **Curbside pickup is an option** for anyone. Thanks for helping us provide safe space for our most vulnerable residents, of all ages!

Library Trustee committees meetings include the Monthly Board Meeting on the third Tuesday of each month (at 6:30 pm, in person), and various Committee meetings, some that meet monthly, vary in time.


