## **COVID News**

**Covid 19 cases are creeping up still. Merrimack County** is now rated as **MEDIUM** risk by the <u>CDC County Check Tool</u> (based on **hospitalizations and deaths, not total cases**). "People with symptoms, a positive test, or exposure to someone with COVID-19 should wear a mask."

NH Counties including Merrimack now rated MEDIUM risk and Grafton, Sullivan and Rockingham are at HIGH Community Transmission risk.

Up to THREE orders of FREE at-home rapid tests delivered by USPS are available

from <a href="https://www.covidtests.gov/">https://www.covidtests.gov/</a> the third set contains eight, shipped in two packages. If you have health insurance through an employer or Marketplace, your insurance will pay you back for 8 at-home tests each month for each person on your plan. More about insurance reimbursement.

# Word Play by Roger Robbins

According to Bill Bryson, in his very readable The Mother Tongue: English and How It Got That Way, says language changes constantly. Words morph and move. 


#### A Brief History of Fascist Lies by Federico Finchelstein




Joanne Randall came to storytime on Thursday May 19th and read her latest book in the Largo series. We enjoyed her story and puppets. Miss

## **Library News**

Tuesday evening Library hours return! The library is now staying open until 8 pm on Tuesdays (but not Thursdays) as of May 3. To keep within budgeted hours, we have dropped the Wednesday morning hours (now opening at 1 pm) - but keeping Monday mornings, 10 am to noon, for now.

Covid protocols at the Library: We are no longer holding returned items in quarantine, so they can be returned inside when we are open, instead of placing them in the Book Drop slot outside. Masks are now optional but encouraged, during library visits unless/until Covid numbers rise again. Curbside pickup is an option for anyone. 
