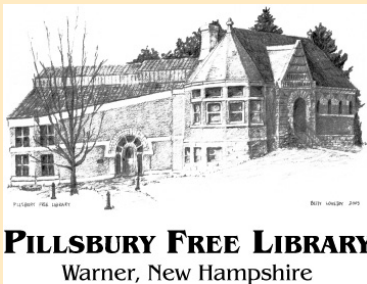

A recent library user pronounced our new **privacy booths** "awesome" after using one for a work meeting online, to avoid distractions at home from a lively toddler. **Sounds are muffled both in and out.** Excellent for personal verbal exchanges such as phone calls or online discussions for telehealth, job interviews, classes, work meetings, or family/ friend online chats. You can bring your own laptop/ tablet or use one of ours. The booths were purchased thanks to federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds, and made possible by the [Institute of Museum and Library Services](https://www.imls.gov/) (IMLS) and the New Hampshire State Library, as well as funds raised by The Circle of Friends of Pillsbury Free Library.

COVID News

Covid 19 Merrimack County is now rated as LOW risk by the [CDC County Check Tool](#) (based on hospitalizations and deaths, not total cases).

7 of 10 NH Counties including Merrimack are rated **LOW** risk of Community Transmission and three are at **MEDIUM** risk according to the **CDC covid-19 data tracker** site <https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view>:

Warner's new cases reported: 3 since last Thursday, 6 active as of 6/9/22. **Total so far 655.** www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#. Note positive **home tests are not included**.

Paxlovid and monoclonal antibody treatments are now available by doctor prescription

Note: Family Tree Health Care in Warner is now offering on-site vaccines to patients

Up to THREE orders of FREE at-home rapid tests delivered by USPS **are available** from <https://www.covidtests.gov/> the third set contains eight, shipped in two packages. If you have health insurance through an employer or Marketplace, **your insurance will pay you back for 8 at-home tests each month** for each person on your plan.

Warner: 66.8% fully vaccinated, 72.9% at least one dose.

Merrimack County (CDC) over age 5: 73.3% fully vaccinated, **88.5%** at least 1 dose.

To get a COVID-19 vaccine: vaccines.nh.gov or call 211. You can also schedule a vaccine through your doctor's office. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE, and available for **ages 5 and up**. **Second boosters** available 4+ months after the first, for ages 50+.

NH fixed vaccination sites include Concord, 8 am to 2 pm every day .

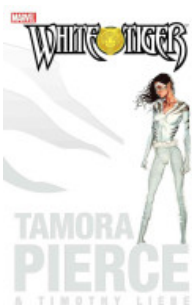

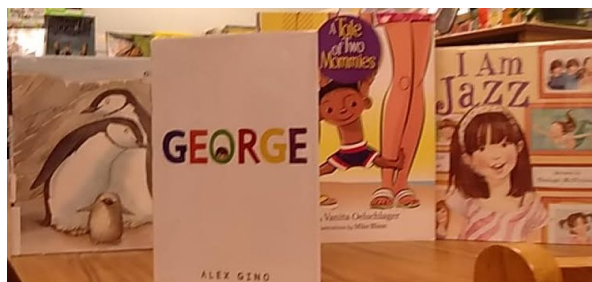
Summer Reading Program brochures are out! All

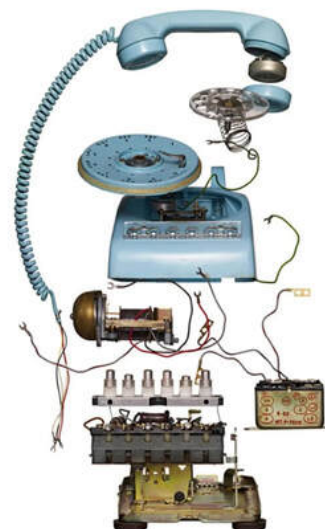

Library Services

Tuesday evening Library hours! The library is now **staying open until 8 pm on Tuesdays** (but not Thursdays) as of May 3. To keep within budgeted hours, we have **dropped the Wednesday morning hours** (now opening at 1 pm) - but keeping Monday mornings, 10 am to noon, for now.

Covid protocols at the Library: We are no longer holding returned items in quarantine, so they can be returned inside when we are open, instead of placing them in the Book Drop slot outside. **Masks are optional but encouraged**, during library visits unless/until Covid numbers rise again. **Curbside pickup is an option** for anyone.
Thanks for helping us provide safe space for our most vulnerable residents, of all ages!

Library Trustee committees meetings include the **Monthly Board Meeting on the third Tuesday of each month (at 6:30 pm, in person)**, and various Committee meetings, some that meet monthly, vary in time.

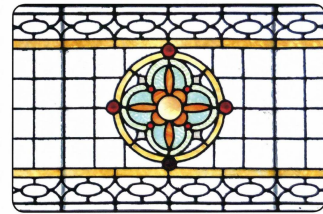
