Happy <u>Juneteenth</u>! Also called Emancipation Day, Freedom Day, Jubilee Day, Black Independence Day, and Juneteenth Independence Day, June 19th marks the day when federal troops arrived in Galveston, Texas in 1865 to take control of the state and ensure that all enslaved people be freed. The troops' arrival came a full two and a half years after the signing of the

Emancipation Proclamation. Juneteenth honors the end to slavery in the United States and is considered the longest-running African American holiday. On June 17, 2021, it officially became a **federal holiday**. Most **Federal offices will be closed MONDAY June 20**.

COVID News

Coming SOON? The CDC will vote on Saturday June 18 about approval of **vaccines for children under 5**. The FDA has recommended approval. The <u>long-awaited</u> COVID vaccines for children between 6 months and 5 years old could arrive in New Hampshire **by June 20**, according to state health officials.

Ages 5-11 were recently approved for a booster. Map of sites for ages 5-11 and other information are at https://www.vaccines.nh.gov/

Warner's new cases *reported*: 2 since last Thursday, 1-4 active as of 6/16/22. Total so far 657. www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#. Note positive home tests are not included.

Paxlovid and monoclonal antibody treatments are now available by doctor prescription **Note: Family Tree Health Care** in Warner is now offering on-site vaccines to patients

Covid 19 Merrimack County is currently rated as LOW risk by the <u>CDC County Check Tool</u> (based on hospitalizations and deaths, not total cases).

7 of 10 NH Counties including Merrimack are **rated LOW** risk of Community Transmission and three are at **MEDIUM** risk according to the **CDC covid-19 data tracker** site https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view:

Up to THREE orders of FREE at- home rapid tests delivered by USPS **are available from** https://www.covidtests.gov/ the third set contains eight, shipped in two packages. If you have health insurance through an employer or Marketplace, **your insurance will pay you back for 8 at-home tests each month** for each person on your plan. More about insurance reimbursement.

In NH, you can arrange for a test through your Doctor's office.
