New Childcare in Warner!

Boys & Girls Clubs of Central New Hampshire will soon be offering full time infant and toddler care at the Warner Community Center (49 West Main Street).

"Our hope is to open two classrooms in the fall, but **this timeline will rely heavily on staff recruitment**. Tuition will be \$300 per week for infants (typically ages 6 wks to about 12 months) and \$275 per week for toddlers (typically about 12 to 36 months). We accept State of New Hampshire Child Care Assistance.

Pre-enrollment begins **Friday**, **July 15**. **We will prioritize Warner residents until August 8.** Applications will be accepted and processed on a first come, first served basis and a wait list will be created if necessary. Sold! Recyclable commodities movement at the Transfer Station by Varrick Proper:

"This past week Warner shipped out **43336 lbs of cardboard**. Sold at \$140.00 per ton the town should realize about \$2500.00 after deductions for shipping. This coming week we are scheduled to ship a similar amount of mixed paper sold at \$77.50 per ton. Had we just thrown this material away it would have cost us close to \$4000.00. The lightening of our tax burden can commence with a weekly recycling habit."

Even if you contract for trash collection, you can separate out these categories and bring them to the Transfer and Recycling Station from time to time to increase Town revenues - and meet your neighbors! **Recycling paper** also conserves natural resources, saves energy, reduces greenhouse gas emissions, and keeps landfill space free for other types of trash that can't be recycled. <u>Article: Is it really better to recyclepaper?</u> **Re-homing household items** or equipment is not always effective in the "swap spot" at the Transfer Station. 
